### What happened during the year...

- Grand Forks and the Boundary experienced an unprecedented
  freshet event in May of 2018 resulting in major flooding
  throughout the region. Boundary Family Services became the
  Wellness and Unmet Needs pillar in the flood recovery effort,
  hiring 5 Flood Recovery Case Managers to assist flood-affected
  residents and businesses in navigating post-disaster resources.
- In the Fall of 2018, Boundary Family Services formally became the agency of record for the management of upcoming BC Housing affordable and supported housing developments in Grand Forks.
  - Breastfeeding Café celebrated its 10th birthday.
  - Boundary Family Services partnered with the Grand Forks
     Farmer's Market and the BC Association of Farmer's Markets to provide over \$7000 in vouchers to pregnant women and families with children under 6 years of age.
